Evidence-Based Nursing: Associate Editor vacancies

Evidence-Based Nursing is looking to appoint two new Associate Editors.

Applications are welcomed from registered nurses or midwives who have a PhD and significant research expertise with a track record in publishing in a range of journals alongside an energetic profile on social media.

Applications are welcome from anywhere in the world, but applicants should be available to host an EBN Twitter Chat at least once every two months (the Twitter Chats are held at 8 pm UK time on the first and third Wednesdays of the month). The associate editors will be expected to:

1. Review article abstracts weekly to help select articles for commentaries (approximately 20-30 abstracts a week with information needing to be submitted once a month via Google docs).
2. Help with the engagement of journal readers using social media by, for example, hosting our Twitter journal club, highlighting new journal content using Twitter, and contributing to the EBN Blog.
3. Write and submit content for the journal (once or twice a year). This may include an editorial, short methods paper, or a summary of evidence-based nursing content from other journals.
4. Peer review contributions from other associate editors (once or twice a year).
5. Provide the editor with advice on the direction of the journal via email and telephone and at our annual editors' meeting. (Reasonable travel expenses covered.)

There will be a small honorarium per year to recognise your contribution to the journal.

Non-nurses or midwives are not eligible to apply for this role.
